




NeWS from year 5 Mr Burkey Writes..


Following on from our parachute experiments earlier in the half-term, Year 5 have been continuing to learn about forces. We learned all about the great scientist Isaac Newton, his discovery of gravity, his work with the refraction of light and the three laws of motion.

The children then looked at motion in action, examining how gears can transmit motion and force between different parts of a machine, helping to change the speed, torque, and direction of movement of a force. We used Newton meters to measure the force needed to lift objects and then examined how a pulley system can be used to lighten the load. We then looked at real life examples of these machines being used.

The children also explored friction, learning how it can help keep cars on the

road or be reduced when ice skating. We conducted an experiment with toy cars on differ-

ent surfaces to see which surface provided the greatest friction against the car.









NeWS from year 2 Mrs Pyrnell Writes.

In Year 2 this week, in maths, we have completed our unit on multiplication. Some activities have been allocated to your School Jam accounts so that you can consolidate this learning at home. We have covered the 2, 5, and 10 times tables, introducing the multiplication sign and supporting learning with repeated addition, skip counting, arrays, and other visual representations of equal groups of objects.

In English, we have been reading The Blue Penguin by Petr Horáček and developing the children's understanding of recount writing by rewriting the story in the first person and using the past tense.

In science, we have been learning about the human life cycle, and in geography, the children planned a journey across the Southern Hemisphere in search of penguin colonies, noting the continents and oceans visited along the way.


Mental Health Service Team
